## GENERAL TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for transfer admission, you need:

- At least 24 semester or 36 quarter credits
- Cumulative college GPA of 2.5 or higher
- To be in academic and disciplinary good standing. USF defines good standing as having a term GPA of 2.00 or higher in the most recent term completed.

Ask your counselor about a special scholarship for CCSF students.
