Personalized Propaganda

In this article (presented at the Yale Law School Propaganda and Emerging Technologies Conference 2024), I trace the history of propaganda through eras of communication media, revealing that the salient factor missing in contemporary propaganda regulation is *personalization*—especially personalization driven by Big Data, the Internet, and AI. I argue that, instead of attempting to govern through speech regulation (which will rarely pass First Amendment scrutiny), lawmakers should regulate propaganda by focusing on privacy and data protection laws that attack the personalization factor.

Not Another AI Copyright Paper

In this article (presented at the Works-in-Progress IP Conference 2024), I argue that policymakers and legal scholars focus too much on copyright law as a solution for AI-related problems. This framing only provides legal remedy for already powerful entities, from Hollywood to Big Tech, ignoring the actual human costs to disempowered individuals, including artists and victims of personality violations. In reality, the real problems that merit legal attention are labor, consumer protection, and personality/privacy rights.
